SCHEDULE A - FARM AND HOME RESIDENTIAL SERVICE

AVAILABILITY: Available for service to residential and public buildings consumers subject to the Cooperative's rules and regulations. Service for the purpose of serving transients shall not qualify for this rate schedule and instead will qualify as a Commercial service.

TYPE OF SERVICE: Single-phase, at 120/240v secondary voltages up to 400 Amps.

RATE MONTHLY:

Base Charge: \$37.50

All kWh: 16.12 cents per kWh

BASE CHARGES: The base monthly charge under the above rate shall be \$37.50. Payment of the charge shall entitle the member in all cases to the use of electric energy. All kilowatt-hours will be billed in accordance with the foregoing rate.

MINIMUM CHARGES: The Minimum monthly charge is the Base Charge, or \$1.00 per kVA of required transformer capacity, whichever is greater.

METER READINGS: Members are responsible for reading and submitting their own meter readings monthly. Unless a demand meter has been installed for the service.

ENERGY COST ADJUSTMENT: If at any time the rate under which the Cooperative purchases electric energy at wholesale is modified, the Cooperative may make a corresponding modification in the rate of service hereunder.

TERMS OF PAYMENT: The above rates are net, the gross rates being ten percent (10%) higher. In the event the current bill is not paid by the due date of the bill, the gross rates will apply.

TEMPORARY DISCONNECTION: If a member requests a disconnection and reconnection of service at the same location within a twelve-month period, the member must guarantee the electric usage equal to the annual MINIMUM CHARGES, plus a disconnection and reconnection charge.

DEMAND BILLING: A demand charge will be billed for any services that warrant a demand meter. in accordance with the Commercial Rate Schedule B.

CONTINUITY OF SERVICE: Seller will use reasonable diligence to maintain uninterrupted service, but

does not guarantee a constant or regular supply of electrical energy and shall not be liable for damage due to variations or cessations in such Supply. Consumer should give immediate notice at the office of the Seller of any interruptions or irregularities in service or any known trouble, defect or accident to the supply. Seller may interrupt service to any consumer or consumers for the protection of life or property, for making repairs, changes, or safety of the public or when in Seller's sole judgment such interruption will prevent or alleviate an emergency threatening the integrity of its system or will aid in the restoration of service. Circumstances permitting, Seller will give reasonable notice of any contemplated suspension. Should service be interrupted for any of the above reasons, or should service fail by reason of any accident, strike, legal process, governmental interference, or any cause whatsoever beyond its control, the seller shall not be liable for damages, direct or consequential, resulting therefrom.
